Formerly director of the Cardiovascular Research Center of the Heart Institute in Hadassah.

Israel Heart Society activity: - 2009-2017member, committee on basic science, 2010-2013 – Member, Israeli Board of Examiners in Cardiology, 2013-2017- Chairman, Israeli Board of Examiners in Cardiology.2017- Chairman, Israeli Working Group on Echocardiography

Research interests: Mitral regurgitation, tricuspid regurgitation, myocardial remodeling

Andreas Triantafyllis



Completed basic studies and cardiology residency in the University Hospital of Athens, Greece, where he also obtained his PhD thesis. Thereafter, followed a full fellowship training in Interventional Cardiology in St Antonius Hartcentrum Nieuwegein, Netherlands, and in the University Hospitals of Leuven, Belgium. He worked as a consultant Interventional Cardiologist in Catharina Ziekenhuis Eindhoven, Netherlands and is currently working in Asklepeion

Hospital Athens, Greece. His main areas of interest include complex coronary interventions, intracoronary imaging and physiology, and research in the field of interventional cardiology and basic science.

Patricia Campbell



Graduated from University College Dublin, with cardiology residency between Ireland and Mayo Clinic. She then undertook her cardiology Specialist Registrar training in Dublin, before moving to Boston to train in Brigham and Women's/Harvard Medical School. She first did an Advanced Heart Failure/Cardiac Transplant fellowship under Lynne Stevenson and Echo fellowship and HF Research under Scott Solomon

and Mark Pfeffer.

She has worked as Clinical Assistant Professor in University of Calgary in Canada, and University College Dublin, working as a HF clinical and researcher, before returning home to take up role as HF Lead in her local trust, in Northern Ireland.

Gregory Y H Lip



Professor Lip, MD, is Price-Evans Chair of Cardiovascular Medicine, at the University of Liverpool, UK – and Director of the Liverpool Centre for Cardiovascular Science at the University of Liverpool and Liverpool Heart & Chest Hospital. Professor Lip has had a major interest into the epidemiology of atrial fibrillation (AF), as well as the pathophysiology of thromboembolism in this

arrhythmia. Furthermore, he has been researching stroke and bleeding risk factors, and improvements in clinical risk stratification. The CHA₂DS₂-VASc and HAS-BLED scores - for assessing stroke and bleeding risk, respectively – were first proposed and independently validated following his research, and are now incorporated into international guidelines. In 2014, Professor Lip was ranked by <u>Expertscape</u> as the world's leading expert in the understanding and treatment of AF, a position still maintained in 2020

Prof Jane Somerville is Emeritus Professor at Imperial College, London, and is globally acknowledged as a pioneer for her research into congenital heart disease. She also helped found the field of Grown Up Congenital Heart Disease and founded the World Congress of Paediatric Cardiology.

Dr Michele Brunelli, is the director of the electrophysiology section at the department of Cardiology in Klinikum Magdeburg, Magedburg. He started his training in clinical and interventional electrophysiology in 2005, and in 2008 moved to Germany (Zentralklinik Bad Berka) to focus on catheter ablation. He obtained his Ph.D. in Cardiac, Vascular, Renal and Metabolic Biology and Physiopathology from the

University of Genova. In 2016, Dr Brunelli moved to Fürth to support the opening of an EP service. His main areas of interest include clinical and invasive management of arrhythmias, and devices follow-up.

José L. Zamorano, MD, PhD is a professor of medicine at the University Alcala de Henares and chief of cardiology at the University Hospital Ramón y Cajal, both in Madrid, Spain. Professor Zamorano is the past secretary of the European Society of Cardiology (ESC), past president of the European Association of Echocardiography

(EAE) and has served as International Advisor of the American College of Cardiology's International Committee, director of the scientific program in imaging for the ESC Congress, Past Chair of the Practice Guidelines Committee of the ESC and Vice President of the ESC.

Alexander Lyon



Dr. Alexander Lyon is a Senior Lecturer in Cardiology at Imperial College London and a Consultant Cardiologist at the Royal Brompton Hospital. His clinical interests are in the field of heart failure, cardio-oncology including chemotherapy cardiomyopathy and the cardiovascular complications of modern cancer therapies, Takotsubo syndrome and the effects of major stresses of the heart, and the

development of novel therapeutics including gene therapy for chronic heart failure.

Panos E. Vardas



Professor Vardas had been the Head of the Cardiology Department at Heraklion University Hospital, Crete, Greece from 1990 until June 2016. His career started at the University of Athens, where he obtained his Medical Degree and his MD Thesis. During the same period, he specialized in Internal Medicine and Cardiology in the clinics of the same University. In 1985 he started working at the Westminster Hospital in

London, Cardiology Department, where he stayed until 1989, focusing on Clinical Electrophysiology and Cardiac Rhythm Management Devices. In 1993 he obtained his PhD in Clinical Electrophysiology from the Charing Cross & Westminster Medical School.

Luca Testa



Professor Luca Testa is an Interventional Cardiologist working at the IRCCS Policinico San Donato in San Donato, Milan, Italy. He is the head of the Coronary Revascularization Unit as well as of the Clinical Research Unit. His areas of research range from platelet aggregation, intracoronary imaging and physiology related to structural heart disease,

particularly the TAVI. He is also particularly interested and involved in the development of new interventional devices. He has a National Scientific Qualification as Associate Professor in Cardiovascular and Respiratory disease, and as Associate Professor in Health Sciences and Applied Medical Technology. He is currently in the Editorial Board and/or reviewer of several peer reviewed cardiology journals and is author of several major publications and book chapters.

Jeroen Bax



Professor Jeroen Bax is director of both non-invasive imaging and the echo-lab at the Leiden University Medical Center in Leiden, the Netherlands. Professor Bax is also the European Society of Cardiology (ESC) immediate past president (2018-2020). His main interests include clinical cardiology, heart failure, cardiac resynchronisation therapy and the

application of all different imaging modalities to these clinical fields. Professor Bax has authored numerous papers and holds several positions in national and international scientific organisations, as well as serving on the editorial board of many different journals.

Franz Weidinger



Proferssor Franz Weidinger is the Head of Department of Medicine at Rudolfstiftung Hospital, a teaching hospital affiliated to Vienna Medical University, Austria.

He earned his M.D. from the University of Vienna and completed his Fellowship Training in General Hospital in Vienna and Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, United States. He has a board

certificate in Cardiology, Internal Medicine, and Intensive Care Medicine from the Austrian Medical Chamber.His major research interests are Acute Coronary Syndromes, STEMI networks, Antiplatelet Therapy, and Cardiovascular Interventional Registries.He is the Vice President of the European Society of Cardiology (ESC) for 2018 – 2020, and past President of the Austrian Cardiological Society. He was a member of the editorial board of Journal for Cardiology in 2003 and EuroIntervention in 2005. President elect of ESC 2020-2022.

Alessandro Giardini



Dr Alessandro Giardini is a top cardiologist based at Great Ormond Street Hospital in London, specialising in paediatric cardiology. An expert on congenital heart disease, Dr Giardini is Director of Inpatient Services at GOSH, and also provides outpatient consultations for all manner of heart problems in children, including palpitations, heart murmurs, chest pain, and heart valve issues. Graduating from

the University of Bologna in his native Italy, Dr Giardini went on to undergo extensive training in paediatric cardiology both in Bologna and in San Francisco, USA. He is actively involved in research, having published over 120 articles in peer-reviewed journals. His unit at GOSH is a world leader in cardiac care. His philosophy is a patient-centric approach, delivering treatment with compassion and understanding, and personalising his consultations and treatment to each child and their family.



Carlo di Mario

Prof Carlo Di Mario was born in Modena, Italy and graduated in medicine, specialising in cardiology, from the University of Padua. He trained in interventional cardiology and worked at the Erasmus University of Rotterdam, the Netherlands, where he completed his PhD. He became professor of cardiology at the University of Florence and director of structural interventional cardiology at

the Careggi University Hospital, Florence, Italy. He has previously served as research and clinical director for interventional cardiology at the University Vita-Salute of the San Raffaele Hospital in Milan and consultant cardiologist at the Royal Brompton and Harefield NHS Foundation Trust. Between January 2003 and November 2016, he was professor of clinical cardiology, NHLI, Imperial College of Sciences, Medicine and Technology, and consultant cardiologist of the Royal Brompton and Harefield Foundation Trust, London.

Dimitrios Farmakis



Associate Professor Dimitrios Farmakis graduated from the Medical School of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens and received his Doctoral Degree on haemoglobinopathy-associated heart disease from the same university in 2003. He specialized in Cardiology at Athens University Hospital and

received his board certification in 2008. He was further trained in Cardio-Oncology at Bern University Hospital, Switzerland, in Heart Failure at Zurich University Medical School, Zurich, Switzerland, and in Clinical Trials at Harvard Medical School, Boston, U.S.A., by which he was awarded a distinction.. His research activity has focused on heart failure, haemoglobinopathies, cardiovascular pharmacology and cardio-oncology. He has served as a member of the European Society of Cardiology (ESC) guideline committee for Cardio-Oncology in 2016 and he is leading the 2019 edition of the Thalassaemia International Federation Guidelines for the management of transfusion-dependent thalassaemia.
